Oct 21 2021 The Government of India constitutes, as a matter of convention, a pay commission after almost every 10 years to review and make recommendations on the wage structure of Central Government civilian and armed forces employees and pensioners. A pay commission, depending on the terms of reference, examines various aspects - such as pay and allowances, retirement and death benefits, conditions of service, promotion policy and such other related matters - of the wage structure of employees and submits its recommendations to the Government. The Government, in turn, takes the final decision as to the implementation of the recommendations, which may be full or partial or amended or modified. The chairman and members of the pay commission are nominated by the Government. A pay

commission is not a constitutional body and therefore the Central Government has a lot of leeway about which part of the report to adopt and in what timeframe. Since India's Independence, 7 pay commissions have been set up, from time to time, to review and recommend wage structure for Central Government employees. Usually a pay commission is given 18 months time to submit its report. A pay commission, before recommending the pay structure, analyzes voluminous data relating, inter alia, to the general economic conditions in the country, financial resources of the government, strength of the work force, and pay structure in public sector and private sector undertakings. Clearly, review and determination of the pay structure of Central Government employees and pensioners is a stupendous and complicated task. Reports of pay commissions provide glimpses of the events, challenges and perceptions of

labour leaders and policy makers during the post-Independence period. The present work provides highlights and summary of recommendations of each of the 7 pay commissions which have reported so far. The work is divided into two parts. Part I deals with the Reports of First to Sixth Pay Commission. Part II is exclusively devoted to the Report of the Seventh Central Pay Commission which was submitted to the Government on November 19, 2015.

programs, FECA pays

disability, survivors, and

medical benefits, without fault,

to employees who are injured

or become ill in the course of

their federal employment and

the survivors of employees

killed on the job. The FECA

program is administered by the Department of Labor (DOL) and the costs of benefits are paid by each employees' host agency. Employees of the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) currently comprise the largest group of FECA beneficiaries and are responsible for the largest share of FECA benefits. This book examines the key policy issues facing the FECA today, including the disproportionate share of claims and program costs attributed to postal workers, the payment of FECA benefits after retirement age, the overall generosity of FECA disability benefits as compared with those offered by the states, and the overall administration of the FECA program.

Government and Its Employees Nov 09 2020 This study comprises five case studies from the ILO 1989 World Labour Report, which examines the employment conditions of public service employees.

These case studies were subcontracted to scholars in developing countries - Egypt, Indonesia, Nigeria, Pakistan and Venezuela. In order to compare the case study results with information from other developing countries, Derek Robinson from Magdalen College, Oxford wrote an overview on government employment and pay. The main message of the studies is that governments had to reduce expenditure on the wage bill, because they had to face up to rapidly increasing debt

payments. Most governments chose to maintain public service employment as much as possible, while they reduced employment in (or privatized) public enterprises.
